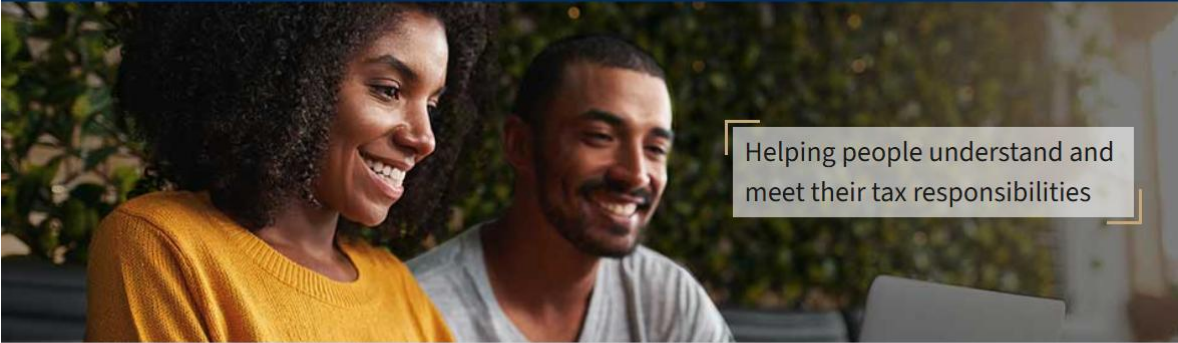

Fix or correct a return

Use this tool to check your refund. Your refund status will appear around:

- 24 hours after you e-file a current-year return
- 3 or 4 days after you e-file a prior-year return
- 4 weeks after you file a paper return

Check your refund

Information is updated once a day, overnight. Where's My Refund is unavailable each morning, generally between 4-5 a.m. Eastern time, while we make these updates.

What you need

- Your Social Security or individual taxpayer ID number (ITIN)
- Your filing status
- The exact refund amount on your return

Separate assessment payment



To make a separate assessment payment, you must make that payment through IRS [individual online account](#) or by check.

Pay your tax balance due, estimated payments or part of a payment plan. Penalties and interest will continue to grow until you pay the full balance.
